Report from Kilburn Parish Council – May/June 2023

Prior to our last meeting in April the Annual Parish Meeting was held where the Chairman, Cllr David Hall gave a report on the work of the Parish Council over the past year. You will find a copy of this report on our website (www.kilburnparishcouncil.gov.uk).

Following on from the Annual Parish Meeting was the final Parish Council meeting of the current Council. We have been notified that the election on 4th May is 'uncontested', this means that there are more places than residents applying to serve on the Parish Council (see separate article). We now have 3 vacancies, and the Council can co-opt anybody wishing to join the Parish Council. Please contact the Clerk if you wish to be considered (kilburnparishcouncil@gmail.com).

As I write this, at the meeting of the Council on 15th May – Members will sign a 'Declaration of Office' and submit a 'Register of Interest' declaration. This then means they are 'officially' Members of the Council and begin their 4-year term.

The Parish Council held a 'Community Day' on Saturday 22nd April (again, see separate article). Prior to this a Member of the Council checked all the defibrillators, and it was found that the defibrillator near the Miners Welfare on Chapel Street was missing! Presumably stolen! This could put somebody's life in jeopardy if relying on the defibrillator being in place. Whoever has stolen it knew the entry code as the box was not damaged. It has been reported to the Police – if anybody knows anything about the theft – please could they either let the Police or the Clerk know. A new defibrillator will be purchased but this will take a while due to current delivery options so bear in mind if there is a problem go to the next nearest defibrillator which is on Chapel Street/corner of Elm Tree Avenue.

Also, since the last meeting a community working party tidied the nature reserve. We are extremely grateful to those volunteers who attended, and it has already made a difference. Another tidy up has been arranged for 20th May.

Our thanks go to Peter Gemmell who has kindly placed a new planter outside of Kilburn Hall – I am sure you will agree that it looks splendid.

The next meeting will be on 12th June at 7.00 pm in the Village Hall. Residents are more than welcome to attend, and a 'Public Participation' agenda item is included so that anybody wishing to voice their opinion of anything may do so.

Update on your Parish Council

As you may have seen it is a local election year, that means that where applicable we went to the polls to vote for our borough and parish councillors.

You may be wondering why you didn't see a voting slip for parish Councillors.

The Kilburn Parish Council is made up of 10 available seats which are optimally filled. To apply to be a parish councillor from May 23 an application needed to be submitted to Amber Valley prior to 4th April. Should 11 or more applications be received we would go to the polls to decide which of those applicants became our Kilburn Parish Council for the next 4 years, until the next election.

For Kilburn seven applications were received. This is not a surprise as just like many parish councils across the country we struggle to fill seats, which is why we are striving to raise awareness of what being a parish Councillor means.

After over 30 years on the Kilburn Parish Council Eric Hetherington decided not to stand. We sincerely thank him for all the hard work he put in and everything that he achieved whilst being a councillor.

Members take office after they have signed the 'Declaration of Office' which in most cases is the first meeting following election, in our case 15th May. As this publication went to print prior to this, we cannot be certain that those who applied now sit on the Parish Council, the best place to see current parish councillors is on the website.

The Kilburn Parish Council does not align with a political party as many other parishes do. This means that whilst the individual councillors may have affiliations with political parties and of course personally choose to vote in favour of different parties, this does not influence the Kilburn Parish Council on a whole. The Council is made up of individuals who want to make Kilburn a wonderful place to live, who have varying political beliefs which do not factor in discussions or decisions of the council on a whole.

Unlike Borough Councillors, County Councillors, MPs and the Prime Minister, Parish Councillors work on a completely voluntary basis and without any pay or financial incentive.

If you would like to learn more about the work of the Parish Council, we always welcome members of the public to attend our meetings.

Local transport

The Derbyshire Connect Access to Health service. This provides a door-to-door service to heath related appointment e.g., doctors, hospital, dentists etc. All passengers are charged a fare dependent on the mileage travelled but the cost is lower than equivalent taxi fares. This service is operated by Ashbourne Community Transport under contract to the County Council. For more details on the service and to book a journey please call 01335 342951.

The Derbyshire Connect Weekly shopping bus service. This provides a once a week shopping trip from every community in the county to a local town centre and or supermarket to enable people to shop and etc for a couple of hours before returning passengers back to their home. Passengers with a Gold Card travel for free on this service with other passengers being charged a fare. Planting Trees

Celebrating Kilburn Village Parish; Speed Indicator Device (SID)

Kilburn Parish Council are proud that we the first village in Derbyshire to apply and obtain a Speed Indicator Device, you may have seen it already situated in our village.

In July 2022, Kilburn Parish Council created a community led plan questionnaire; speeding came back as the top priority under question "what would be your policing priorities". Also, village speeding comments were heavily common throughout that questionnaire.

When the opportunity arose for Derbyshire Parish Councils to apply to have a SID along with grant funding available through Derbyshire PCC. Kilburn Parish Council acted quickly; they knew that this would be an ideal way to help tackle village speeding awareness whilst also collecting valuable data and insights into speeding trends to pass onto Derbyshire Highways and Derbyshire Police.



The Questionnaire responses along with the work and support of Kilburn Parish Council and Community Speedwatch helped strengthen the application for a licence and applying to obtaining a funding Grant. It was a lengthy progress and took nearly a years' work to complete. During that time Kilburn Parish Council are grateful for the help and advice that they received from: Derbyshire Highways, Richard Handbury, Cllr Trevor Ainsworth, grant funding from Derbyshire Police Commissioner and to the residents of Kilburn who took time in completing the questionnaire.

SID positions and data:

Rykneld Road is where the SID is currently positioned, this road is notorious for reported speeding, accidents and animals being run over, it was decided that this would be the first position. The SID is **multi directional**, it can be turned to indicate traffic speed in both directions. When the Parish Council has collated data over a 12-month period, it will be published in this newsletter. At present there are 5 licenced locations (sites where there are speeding issues) where the SID will be positioned in the village.

Kilburn Parish Council hope that the SID will have a positive impact on reducing speeding in our village now and for years to come.

Kilburn Community Speed Watch



I want to say a **Massive Thank** you to everyone who visited our table at the Kilburn Parish Community Day. It was so interesting talking to you all. And a special thanks to the 4 New Volunteers and those who are currently thinking about it.



Without You we wouldn't have a Community Speedwatch

We want to keep **growing in Numbers** so we can cover more sites and continue to educate/remind more drivers on our roads to **drive safely** through our village. **If you are interested in Joining** us or want to know more about what we do or want to volunteer, please email admin@kilburncsw.org.uk that would be **amazing**.

Some of the **Questions we were asked** that I would like to share:

Q: Do You get Paid?

A: No, we're all volunteers, including the coordinators.

Q: How often do you do it?

A: Our aim is to be out at least once to twice per month. As our numbers grow, we will be able to do more. Our sessions tend to be around 1 hour.

Q: Where do you operate?

A: We now have 13 sanctioned sites spread around the village. We can add more. Our sites need to be safe for us to operate in, so we do need to get them sanctioned through Derbyshire CSW.

Q: Do you enforce the law?

A: No, we don't. Our presence and aim is purely educational. Our aim is to remind the majority of road users that there is a speed limit and ask that you please adhere to it for good sound, safety reasons. There will always be a few that our presence will not affect, and the police will get involved if they repeatedly are found to be driving over the limits, but we do not take any part in the enforcement.

Q: As a volunteer, Do I have to be available on certain days/times?

A: No, we're all volunteers. Your time is precious. We have a WhatsApp group where we can communicate when we are planning to run a watch and if anyone is able/want to Join us. We need 3 People minimum to run a session. It's my role as coordinator to find suitable times, around our busy schedules and of course make sure you are comfortable to do it.

Q: What will my role be?

A: We have no set Roles and happily rotate during a session. The roles are:

- 1.) Recording the Number of Vehicles during the Session.
- 2.) Using the Speeding Gun: calling out the speed. If speeding:
- a. Calling out the Registration Number.
- b. Calling out the Make and Model/ Colour of the Car. This is so Derbyshire CSW can check registration against make/model/colour to ensure we have recorded the right vehicle.
- c. Recording all the Info being shouted out.
- 3.) Coordinator sends the Data off to Derbyshire CSW post the Session. Strictly speaking a coordinator does not need to be at a session anyone can step into that role for the Session.

Q: Can I be a coordinator?

A: Absolutely. We need official coordinators to help organise Sessions, coordinate between the group and Derbyshire CSW and help with training.





Arthur Medical Centre Update



Introducing the Care Navigation Team

Over recent months, Arthur Medical Centre has been engaged in various efforts to review our processes and services and is committed to an ethos of continual improvement. We have recently completed an initial review of patient accessibility and identified areas for improvement in some of our internal processes and policies.

One outcome related to the work carried out by our Reception Team in the practice. As the landscape of Primary Care has changed over recent years, the role of a practice reception team has expanded beyond answering of telephones and booking appointments. NHS Primary Care has developed to include additional routes for patients to receive the most appropriate care, such as referrals to NHS 111, Urgent Treatment Centres and Community Pharmacies — all of which require an increased level of awareness, knowledge, and skill. We have therefore re-designated this important patient-facing team to now become our **Care Navigation Team** as this is more reflective of the work that they now do. Our Care Navigators are here to help you and are trained to direct you to the most appropriate route for your individual needs. Please help us to help you and others by accepting the appointment or referral given by the Care Navigation Team.

Long Term Conditions Reviews

Arthur Medical Centre has recently improved the way we organise our annual reviews for patients with long term condition, such as Asthma, Heart Disease, Diabetes etc.

From this year, patients will be invited to make an appointment for their annual review around the time of their birthday. You will receive a communication from the practice asking you to arrange an appointment with our Care Navigation team. There may be times where appointments are not readily available at a suitable time due to the levels of demand currently on the practice, therefore please be patient and try and book an appointment when you can. Your regular medicines will continue to be prescribed when you need them if we can see that your review is booked.

DNA (Did Not Attend)

Over the month of April, **114 patients did not attend their appointments** and did not give notice of cancellation, which would have allowed us to offer these appointments to other patients who needed to access a clinician. This represents up to **28 & ½ hours of patient contact time across the month**.

On one morning, 4 patients did not attend their appointments with our Mental Health Worker in the practice, wasting 60 minutes each which could have been given to other patients.

Practice appointments are a precious resource – especially given current pressures - and patients can be frustrated when trying to book GP and Nurse appointments. Please help us to help you and others by notifying the practice if you are unable to attend your appointment to allow us to offer the time to other patients.

Registrar GPs

Arthur Medical Centre is proud to be a training practice, supporting the development and training of future Primary Care GPs. GP Registrars are assigned to training practices for a period of placement and are rotated round a variety of practices and hospital departments to give them a broad experience of the NHS.

Dr Sophie Bell and Dr Rehab Ali have just completed their placement at Arthur Medical Centre and move on to other practices as part of their training programme. Dr Waheed Tufail will remain at the practice, and Dr Bahaa Kasem and Dr Mohamed Omar have newly joined the practice as Registrar GPs.

Practice Statistics

As of 1st May, Arthur Medical Centre has **9,087 patients registered with the Practice.**Over the month of April, Arthur Medical Centre has:

- handled 4,232 incoming telephone calls (an average of 235 calls handled per working day). This compares
 to 3,674 calls over the same period last year an increase of 15%
- provided 3,302 patient appointments in total (an average of 183 per working day).
- Of these appointments, **1,946** were face-to-face appointments (an average of 108 per working day and around 59% of the total)

Patient Feedback Meeting

As part of our continuing work to improve our accessibility and our communications, we are planning to host an open online meeting in June via Zoom, where patients of the Practice may attend and receive some insight into the running of the practice. Patients will be welcome to ask general questions related to the services offered by the Practice, to members of the Partnership and Practice Management team and to members of our Patient Participation Group (PPG). Understandably, this meeting will not be a suitable forum to raise queries or issues relating to individual clinical matters, or to complaints specific to individual patients and these would be best addressed in a clinical appointment, or by referring to the Practice Business Manager. Dates for this meeting will be confirmed and will be advertised on the Practice Website at https://www.arthurmedicalcentre.co.uk/ in the near future.

All of the staff at Arthur Medical Centre strive to deliver an exceptional level of care to each and every patient, and we do so within the parameters of available resources and funding.
