Following the resignation of Cllr Dean Warren and Cllr Kevin McDonald—there are now two vacancies on the Parish Council—anybody requiring further information should contact the Clerk.

Thank you for all the comments received with regard to the Christmas lights. A decision has been made that the lights will not go around the War Memorial, but that additional lights will be placed on the Christmas tree.

The Council also received offers of assistance to set up a community garden in the decommissioned Play Area on Fairview Close and we are sincerely thankful for those offers. We have now been informed that the Company from whom Amber Valley BC lease the land has gone into bankruptcy and the Council will be pursing the matter with the legal team at Amber Valley BC.

We have also received volunteers for the Speedwatch Campaign (again – we are extremely grateful). Training will soon take place and you will soon see Speedwatch taking place in Kilburn and Denby.

You will see a separate article with regard to the Annual Garden Competition which will take place in its usual form this year.

The Council have submitted an application for a Grant from the Community Fund Lottery in order to complete the work at the nature reserve. In the meantime, Cllr Trevor Ainsworth has kindly donated £1000 from the Community Leadership Scheme for the project.

A community litter pick will be held on Saturday 23rd April—meeting at 11am in Church Street car park.

As you receive this newsletter Derbyshire County Council will have, all being well, removed its Covid secure measures. We have however brought in new working practices that are allowing those who want to work from home to continue to do so. This is minimising the face to face contact staff are having .

The virus has not gone away and although the newest strain does not seem to be as dangerous, I am aware of quite a few people whose illness although milder is lasting a lot longer. It does no harm to continue to wash hands thoroughly and keep as safe as possible.

I do hope you are all well and coping with the new found freedom that most of us are able to enjoy. We just need the weather to get a tad warmer!

Most of the local villages are now well into planning the celebrations for the Queen platinum Jubilee. Those involved in organising special events, have been in touch and assisted where possible with funding from Derbyshire County Council.

Vision Derbyshire

Two initiatives to support Derbyshire businesses are being run as part of Vision Derbyshire— a partnership of Derbyshire councils working to improve the way the councils work together and improve services for residents.

The Derbyshire Festival of Business, coordinated by University of Derby and the East Midlands Chamber of Commerce, has been set up to help businesses recover from the Covid-19 pandemic, offering a wide range of free workshops, masterclasses and networking activities at derby.ac.uk/business-services/fob.

The Vision Derbyshire Business Start Up Programme provides help and advice to Derbyshire residents looking to set up their own business and throughout the first year of trading. Derbyshire.gov.uk/visionderbyshirebusinessupport.

Towards Work Project

Are you looking for personalised support to help you get back into work, education or training? - or do you know someone who is?

Derbyshire County Council are supporting the Towards Work project which helps Derbyshire residents to overcome barriers and get on the road to gaining employment.

The scheme offers free tailored one-to-one support for around 12 months including supporting an individual to remove barriers preventing them to move on their jounrye. This is followed by CV building and interviewing skills, support with costs for childcare, travel, work equipment and gaining qualifications and up to a further three months support once you get a job.

It's open to anyone who lives in Derbyshire and is over the age of 16, but 15 year-olds who are not in work, education or training or are at risk of falling into this group are also eligible.

Workforce Update

Dr Sarah Hedgethorne is relocating and is therefore unfortunately leaving her role at Arthur Medical Centre in April. Dr Hedgethorne has been an important part of our team, both as a registrar doctor and a member of our permanent GP team and whilst she will be missed by colleagues and patients, we wish her the very best for her future career.

Unfortunately, we must also share that a member of our Practice Nursing team, **Angela**, is also leaving the Practice for another opportunity. Angela has proven to be an excellent nurse and offered us support during a very difficult period, through the pandemic and its impact on our nursing resource. Angela will also be missed by all our team and our patients, and we wish her all the very best.

I am pleased to confirm however that **Dr Megan Foreman** will be joining the Practice in June. Dr Foreman has worked at our practice in the past as a registrar doctor and we are delighted that she is coming to join us as part of our permanent GP team.

I am also pleased to confirm that we have completed recruitment for the anticipated gap in our nursing resource. Two Practice Nurses will join the Practice in May which also represents an increase in our nursing hours and an increase in patient-facing appointments. We will share details of our appointees in our next update.

Patient Services

As shared in our last update, many practices across the country reduced or suspended non-essential patient services to support the vaccination and booster programmes, in accordance with directions from the Government and NHS England. Arthur Medical Centre maintained our usual levels of patient services and access throughout the booster campaign, although some non-essential services, such as minor surgery and ear syringing were curtailed or suspended or provided elsewhere like contraception Now that the booster campaign is largely completed, we are now gradually reintroducing these services at our practice over the next two months. There are waiting lists for certain services which we will begin to work our way through as we begin to reintroduce these areas of work. We would therefore ask for your patience and understanding for any apparent delay whilst we address the outstanding work.

Winter access and increased appointments

Following the impact of the pandemic and vaccination campaigns, Primary Care and General Practice has been under a great deal of pressure both from a backlog of work and from increased patient demand. This has been reported widely in the media and great efforts have been made to satisfy patient demand and improve accessibility to Primary Care services.

With the support of the local Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), Arthur Medical Centre has provided an additional **574 GP appointments** over and above our usual level of services from the period of January to the end of March. The majority of these additional appointments were face-to-face appointments. Most of this provision has been achieved with locum resources at significant cost. However, our focus has been on improving accessibility and responding to increased demand during the winter, which is always a very busy period in any year. We are delighted to have been able to provide this additional resource to our patients during our busy winter period but will be falling back to more normal provision from April.

Practice Statistics

As of end of Feb 2022, Arthur Medical Centre's patient list totals **9,005 patients** - an increase of 114 patients since the same point in 2020.

Over the month of February, Arthur Medical Centre has:

• handled **4,078 incoming telephone calls** (an average of 204 calls handled per working day)

• provided **4100 patient appointments** in total (an average of 205 per working day)

• Of these appointments, **1,817 were face-to-face appointments** (an average of 91 per working day) **68** patients did not attend their appointments and did not give notice of cancellation, which would have allowed us to offer these appointments to other patients who needed to access a clinician. This represents **17 hours of clinical time across the month.**
