Support in the community during the Coronavirus Pandemic

By the time this edition of Kilburn News is delivered, we have no doubt that life across the local area and in fact the country will be very different. The main impact will be that the large majority of elderly and vulnerable residents will be part way into the self isolation period and may be apprehensive about who to ask should they need shopping, prescriptions and other urgent household items collecting.

Residents will be reassured to know that the Kilburn & Denby Neighbourhood Watch have teamed up with local charities and the public sector to provide a service to the residents of Kilburn, Denby & Horsley Woodhouse where a team of 25 volunteers are available around the clock to assist with urgent tasks.

All you need to do is telephone their dedicated number <u>07756762192</u> and a member of the team will take a few details from you and allocate a volunteer to offer support. All volunteers are fully insured and will arrange a convenient time to come round to see you.

The team also have an emergency supply of food items for the elderly should they require a 1-2 day supply until other alternative arrangements can be made. There is also a supply of sanitary products and nappies available should any females need a small emergency supply until they can make it to the shops.

COVENANT

Armed Forces Covenant

The Parish Council signed a Armed Forces Covenant to support the Armed Forces Community. By signing the covenant the council recognise the value Serving Personnel, both Regular and Reservists, Veterans and military families contribute to **ARMED FORCES** our business and our country.

The key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, are;

- No member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen.
- In some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.

By signing the covenant the council commit to the following;

- Appointing an Armed Forces Champion who will raise awareness of the Armed Forces Covenant and signpost the Armed Forces community when needing advice and guidance;
- Promote the fact that we are an Armed Forces-friendly Council, to our members and wider public, celebrating the work of the Armed Forces and encouraging positive interaction between them and members of the public;
- Recognise that military veterans are a valued part of our community, facilitating and encouraging their participation in civic, and community events; providing a link to the Veterans Gateway on our website;
- Encourage local businesses to support the employment of service spouses, partners and reservists;
- Encourage support for and membership of local military sponsored cadet units;
- Promote Armed Forces events such as local Breakfast Clubs, Armed Forces Day, Reserves Day, the Poppy Appeal Day and Remembrance activities;
- **Encourage support for Armed Forces Charities**
- Encourage local businesses to consider offering discounts to members of the Armed Forces community

The council will publicise these commitments through our literature, noticeboards, and on our website, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and customers on how we are doing.

Notes from the parish council meeting:

Prior to the March meeting of the Parish Council a presentation was made to the Parish Warden and Clerk in recognition of their long service e.g. 25 and 30 years respectively.

The Parish Council has organised a community litter pick on Saturday 4th April – by the time you receive this edition of the Kilburn News – the litter pick will have taken place and hopefully the village will be looking much tidier. Thank you to everybody who took part.

By request of the Governors of Kilburn Infant School the Christmas sign (currently unlit) is to be taken down. The Parish Council would like to hear ideas from residents as to where they think this could be positioned in the future. Unfortunately, the cost of putting it back up in the current position next Christmas is prohibitive.

The recent rain has caused flooding at the nature reserve. A contractor has been requested to make safe a number of trees which are either leaning or fallen. The Council is in discussion with the River Trust as to other works and future improvements. Residents are asked to take care when visiting the nature reserve whilst work is taking place.

All equipment has now been purchased for the Neighbourhood Watch Group to proceed with the Speedwatch Campaign.

The Parish Council remains in discussion with Amber Valley Borough Council to have the litter bin on Chapel St (adjacent to the chip shop) replaced.

As reported in a previous edition the Parish Council has signed up to the Armed Forces Covenant and is looking into ways to link ex service men and women with activities within the parish. Any suggestions from residents will be considered, please contact the Clerk.

The Parish Council is filling the 'poo bag dispensers' located around the village with 150 bags per week in each dispenser. Unfortunately, some residents are removing these bags almost as soon as the dispensers have been filled, therefore, depriving other dog owners of the facility. If this continues the Council will be unable to continue providing the bags.

The Parish Council welcomes a new editor of the Kilburn News – Alex Steward. Alex lives locally and we wish her well in this new position.

St Susanna's Church - Patronal Festival 14th to 16th August

St Susanna's life is commemorated on 11th August. She had a short life with an unhappy ending. It was not a good idea to refuse the hand in marriage of Emperor Diocletian's son in the days of the Roman Empire if you wished to keep a head on your shoulders.

We are holding our first patronal festival on the weekend of 14th to 16th August. The life of Saint Susanna provided only a little for us to build on therefore our theme for the event is 'The Female Saints and Heroines of the Church of England'. With no process for creating saints in the post-Reformation centuries, the Church of England commemorates the lives of notable Christian Heroes and Heroines. Amongst the latter are famous missionaries such as Gladys Aylward and Mary Slessor, nurses such as Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell, and the social reformers, Octavia Hill and Elizabeth Fry.

The Programme for our pioneering weekend will include the following:

A Flower Festival in the Church running over the three days
A Horticultural and Produce Show on Saturday 15th the Church Hall
Refreshments served in the Church Hall during the Flower Festival opening hours
A competition for young people organised in co-operation with the School
A Special Service on either the Sunday afternoon or evening.

Other events may still be added to the emerging programme such as a special Friday night Quiz Night and a musical concert.

Kilburn Infant School News...



We've had a very enjoyable term in school, although we think that the end of our Spring term learning and activities will be disrupted or postponed due to Coronavirus, and because of the major premises works we are having to our Nursery windows, internal Nursery ceiling, and a new whole school Fire alarm that is being installed.

All of our Infant children have taken part in 'Memorable Experiences' their classes as part of their half-termly learning themes, including visits to Crich Tramway and Derby Garden Centre, and an animal handling session in school, with meercats, lizards and snakes. We held a 'Big Read Book Cafe' for families, a Book dressing-up day and Book Fair, wrapped & swapped books from home, and had a themed lunch, with five lucky children finding Golden tickets! Children took photos of themselves completing our 'Bingo/Book Challenge', and posted them on our Facebook page.

'Christians in Derbyshire Schools' came to lead assemblies with us and we also thought about communities and helping others by taking part in activities and fundraising for 'Sport Relief' walking laps of the school grounds all together & collecting money for the Charity.

Our School Council theme is thinking of fundraising ideas for our summer visit to the seaside at Anderby Creek, and are busy organising an Easter Egg raffle and tombola. It is hard to believe that we are already half way through the school year and it is lovely to feel the first signs of spring in the air and around school despite the wet weather we've been experiencing.

INSPIRE curriculum - Environmental Awareness

Over the past few months, we have been developing a new curriculum in school that will inspire our pupils.



We have used the Oxfam's Global Citizenship framework to develop a curriculum that is creative, current and connected to today's world.

A global citizen is someone who is aware of and understands the wider world - and their place in it. They take an active role in their community, and work with others to make our planet more equal, fair and sustainable.



For Oxfam, global citizenship is all about encouraging young people to develop the knowledge, skills and values they need to engage with the world. And it's about the belief that we can all make a difference.

Last term's topics were based around the theme of sustainable development, with a strong focus on the environment and climate change.

The topic concluded with an art exhibition, organised by the pupils in the hall, as a way of presenting and celebrating the work and achievements of the pupils.

The occasion was a huge success and people from across the community were in attendance during the afternoon.

Kilburn Neighbourhood Watch

The number of burglaries often increases during the spring, when burglars tend to target gardens and allotments for valuable tools and equipment stored in outbuildings.

- Always lock your shed, preferably with two 'hasp and staple' locks (one near the top and one near the bottom of the door) or use or an alarmed padlock
- Secure your rear garden by locking entry gates with a padlock
- Burglars can use garden tools to break in, so make sure you securely lock away any tools after use
- Ensure boundary fences are secure and in good condition. Spiky plants along garden boundaries are good additional deterrents
- Tools and gardening equipment should be visibly marked with your postcode and house number this can deter thieves and help police identify the rightful owner
- Remember to lock your garage door securely. Metal 'up and over' doors can be secured with extra locks fitted either side and/or a floor-mounted locking 'T' bar with a closed shackle padlock.
 Wooden garage doors can be secured with two substantial 'hasps and staple' locks and closed shackle padlocks (your local DIY store can advise on the most secure options)
- Join Neighbourhood Watch or Allotment Watch to help reduce crime in your local area.

There have also been a number of catalytic convertors stolen across Amber Valley in recent weeks and Derbyshire Constabulary have provided the following crime prevention advice

- If possible, park in a garage or in a position where it would be difficult to access the underside of the vehicle near the exhaust.
- Consider marking the catalytic converter with a serial number to identify it, and register it on sites such as Immobilise.
- Consider installing protective coverings over the converter, but seek advice from a professional as
 different makes offer different types which are safe. This may not prevent it from being stolen, but
 would make it more difficult and slow down the process.
- Install alarms and CCTV.
- Good quality lighting near to your vehicle will improve natural surveillance and can act as a deterrent.
- If you see anyone acting suspicious/appearing to be working on a car in a public car park, please report it to us.

Cllr Kevin Buttery - Keeping you Updated

There is no doubt that the Coronavirus Pandemic will have an impact upon each and every one of us in some way or another. Whether as a result of the virus itself, or due to restrictions on travel and holidays abroad, socialising with others, panic buying of toilet rolls and foodstuffs or a downturn in the economy which will affect both national and local businesses. We, are in unprecedented and worrying times, being bombarded with advice and opinions on how to keep safe, coming from all directions.

Derbyshire County Council works closely with the NHS and others in an attempt to ensure you are kept well informed. Its website www.derbyshire.gov.uk is regularly updated in an effort to highlight the whereabouts of cases in Derbyshire as well as the symptoms and prevention measures that can be taken. Advice is provided for schools and parents, emotional health and wellbeing and information on the role of Public Health. Please use the website for information.

The Government has outlined its commitment to supporting councils to focus their efforts on the priority areas of social care, providing vital support for vulnerable people and supporting local economies.

To enable councils to focus on delivering front line services, both the local council elections together with the election of the Police & Crime Commissioner have been postponed for 12 months. Financial audits have been deferred until the 30th September and new legislation is being considered to allow the holding of 'virtual' council committee meetings for a temporary period, in an effort to avoid face to face meetings.

I welcome the Chancellor's commitment to provide financial support of £12billion to support public services, individuals and businesses through the economic disruption of Covid-19. Only time will tell as to whether this will be enough, as the situation is changing on a daily basis. Help for businesses include an increase in the Business Rates retail discount to 100% for one year, which has been expanded to include the leisure and hospitality sectors, and increased the planned rates discount for pubs to £5,000. An estimated 900,000 properties, or 45% will receive 100% business rate relief in 2020 to 2021.

A new temporary Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme, delivered by the British Business Bank, should be launched in a matter of weeks. Derbyshire County Council has also set up a Covid-19 Community Response Unit to bring agencies and volunteers together. The Unit will be led by public health and emergency planning officers. The council has also agreed an initial £1m coronavirus fund to help support vulnerable residents and affected businesses.

This is a time we all need to pull together to keep everyone as safe and protected as possible. I have no doubt over the coming weeks agencies, as well as the council will be looking for volunteers to assist in helping our most vulnerable residents and supporting vital services. So please keep checking www.derbyshire.gov.uk for the latest updates. Be sensible, follow guidelines, keep safe.

NHS Coronavirus Guidance

The following information is from the NHS website.

You are advised to stay at home if you have the following symptoms;

- A high temperature— this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
- A new continuous cough— this means coughing a lot for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24hours.

When and how long to stay at home

- If you have symptoms of coronavirus, you'll need to stay at home for 7 days.
- If you live with someone who has symptoms, you'll need to stay at home for 14 days from the day the first person in the home started having symptoms.

If you live with someone who is 70 or over, has a long-term condition, is pregnant or has a weakened immune system, try to find somewhere else for them to stay for 14 days.

Advice for people at high risk

If you're at high risk of getting seriously ill from coronavirus, there are extra things you should do to avoid catching it.

These include

- Self Isolating and not leaving your home you should not go out to do shopping, visit friends or family or attend any gatherings.
- Avoid close contact with other people in your home as much as possible.

If you are considered high risk, you will be contacted by the NHS by Sunday 29th March 2020 with more information.

Although the Parish Council will not be holding meetings—members are still available and any resident with any problem should contact the Parish Council via the website. Their problem will be directed to the appropriate person. Residents should keep an eye on both the Amber Valley and Parish Council websites for local news.

We are all trying our best to help support our community, and appreciate your help in this time of crisis. Please only contact the surgery when really necessary, to enable us to focus on those who need us most.

For those who are starting to think about spring and summer and all that brings, it may also mean the start of troublesome hay fever symptoms. We wanted to ensure that you are aware of the changes the Practice made last year as a result of new guidance introduced by NHS England. The guidance made recommendations that GPs and other healthcare professionals should no longer routinely prescribe medicines which can be bought over the counter for minor and self-limiting conditions. These conditions include hay fever, cough and colds, temperatures/fevers, indigestion and headaches. Self-care is widely acknowledged as an important solution to managing demand and keeping the NHS sustainable. Please help us protect our NHS.

We would also like to remind you of the valuable service your community pharmacy offers. They are trained professionals who are able to talk through your symptoms, offering advice and reassurance on how long these may last and what to do if these continue or get worse.


