Two vacancies exist on the Council – if you have an interest in supporting the Parish Council to improve Kilburn for the residents - please contact the Clerk for further details.

Update on progress with work on the Nature Reserve - It is proving difficult to gain funding to progress the work on the nature reserve especially during the current economic climate. However, we continue to bid for funding – if only to complete work already undertaken thereby completing phase 1 of the project. The Council will update residents on progress as and when it happens.

Community Speedwatch has operated in Kilburn recently and the Council have been given the statistics for vehicles found to be speeding. The details of those vehicles have been sent to CREST.

There is great concern about the Amberline bus service which travels through Kilburn to Heanor. Amberline have stated that the route is not financially viable. This bus service is a lifeline to residents of Kilburn and there is no other service which travels to Heanor.

The Parish Council have written to the County Councillor and Borough Councillor as well as Trent Barton who operate the service asking for the decision to be re-considered.

We have also asked neighbouring Parish Council's for support.

The Parish Council is advertising for a Parish Warden – see the separate notice in this Newsletter.

A community Parent & Baby group is to be set up in the Village Hall. A donation will be made by Wood Lane Garage to enable the group to proceed. The Parish Council is to support the funding of hiring toys.

A resident has asked that we thank the staff at the Metro Stores for providing such a wonderful display of flowers this summer. The display has been much appreciated by residents.

The Remembrance Day service & parade will be held on Sunday 13th November – meeting at Bown Close at 2pm to parade to the War Memorial for a short service. This will then be followed by a service in the Baptist Church on Highfield Rd. Volunteers are always needed – if you would like to help – please contact the Clerk.

A reminder that there will be a Carol Service in the Baptist Church on Friday 9th December at 6.30pm.

At the time of going to press we have learnt of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The Parish Council was extremely saddened to hear the news and our thoughts and condolences are with the nation and the Royal family at this time.

Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II

As I write this I have just returned from Derby Cathedral, where I was attending The Civic Service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving, for Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. It was a gathering to give thanks for the life of our Late Queen, to express our deep sorrow at her death. I was invited to represent the residents in the Horsley Division. It was very moving, and we sang a couple of her favourite hymns.

Bywell Lane

Apologies for the length of time that Bywell Lane was closed. However, as anyone that has used the new pavement, what a difference it has made. During the closure one dangerous tree was taken out and all the other trees and growth was surveyed, more work was identified, but at the time there were nesting birds present and it could not be done.

Keeping Warm This Winter

Amber Valley Borough Council have received a grant from the government that is available to help you keep you warmer and help counter the current increases in energy prices we are all facing.

The main measure that is being offered for installation is external wall insulation but, depending on suitability they may also include loft insulation and cavity wall insulation (subject to survey). If you meet the following conditions:

You could qualify if you answer 'yes' to the following questions:

Is your property off-gas/does not have a gas boiler for heating and hot water?

Do you own your own home? - if you rent your property, we will need permission from your landlord as they will be required to make a contribution towards the work

Do you have a total household income of less than £30,000 a year (before tax)?

If you know the EPC rating of your home, is it D or less? To find out whether your property has a valid EPC visit www.gov.uk/find-energy-certificate

If you answered 'yes' to the previous questions and believe you are eligible, then please contact AVBC, either by:

Free School Meals

Derbyshire County Council are encouraging parents of children aged 3 to 18 to check their eligibility for free school meals.

Parents can sign up to free school meals at any time of the year and the process is quick and easy.

To qualify, parents should be in receipt of one of the following:

- Universal Credit, provided they have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190) as assessed by HMRC
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Find out more and check if you're eligible for free school meals go to the Derbyshire County Council web site and type in the search bar "free school meals" or call the team on 01629 536481.



Kilburn Community Speed Watch makes the next page look like a different article



Who are we?

Kilburn Parish Community Speed Watch is a voluntary team and is run in partnership with Denby Parish CSW team. We are strongly supported by both Parish Councils, who purchased the necessary equipment needed. At the start of this year there was a

recruitment drive, and we are pleased to announce that there are two new coordinators, one in each parish and several new volunteers. Over the past months through training and meetings there has been a strong relationship built between the two parish teams.

What is the purpose of a CSW?

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is a scheme to allow trained volunteers to address speed concerns in their communities. Community Speed Watch supports the Police by monitoring the speed of vehicles through local communities. Community Speed Watch does not enforce the law but those identified as exceeding the speed limit can expect to receive an advisory letter from the Police. Community Speed Watch is designed to support the Police by making us all **aware** of the dangers of travelling too fast for the prevailing conditions.

The overall casualties in Derbyshire in 2019 and 2020 was a staggering 4,019. As I'm sure you will agree, this cannot continue. The work of Kilburn Community Speed Watch is aimed at reducing the above statistics and make our community a safer place.

Introducing Your Kilburn Coordinator



Hi I am Andrew have lived in Kilburn for 24 years & enjoy living in such a lovely area with my wife and family. last year I volunteered to be a CSW coordinator. Prior to this I was a volunteer within the Kilburn CSW team. I wanted to volunteer because speeding in Kilburn and surrounding villages had been increasing over many years and become even more so post covid restrictions being lifted. This was observed not only as myself as a driver with cars driving up to my bumper to then dangerously take over at high speed, but also through friends and family, complaints being aired on social media, complaints of near misses being raised with the Parish council and many pets being runover and killed also on the increase.

I have seen through doing CSW sessions that, it has had a significant impact on making people aware that they are speeding and through continued presence and education we can make a lasting difference and reduce the risks brought on us all by speeding in community areas.

As a volunteer coordinator, I hope to bring people together from our community who are concerned about speeding, give them a voice and an opportunity to actively participate in our awareness campaigns and roadside sessions, providing a vital link between trained volunteers and SNT's, specialist policing units and our Parish Council. This helps our CSW be as effective as possible. working together is always the best.

Going forward, You are being listened to, your views count!

Currently the team and I are working closely with Kilburn Parish Council. They have recently published a questionnaire, and under the heading "what would be your policing priorities" speeding was at the top of concerns with 60 out of 171 residences making this their number one priority and there were specific comments as to the areas of concern.

Taking this information, I have been around to view those locations and the entire village with a Parish Councillor. We are now currently applying through the Derbyshire CSW for more sites, there are 16 in total. Not all will be suitable, but we have chosen several positions on those roads that were mentioned, plus a few other locations, so we are hopeful that we will, together be able to enhance our coverage further.

How can you help ... We need volunteers - Come join us

At present we are aiming to do a minimum of 2 speed watch sessions a month. We need more volunteers to cover this and the hopeful new locations to cover our communities' concerns. The sessions are no longer than an hour, they can be done at anytime of day as long there's adequate day light, 2-4 persons need to be present per session. Full training is given by Derbyshire CSW along with myself and or the Denby Coordinator.

Can you help marshal the Remembrance Sunday Parade?

Every year the Kilburn Parish Council puts on the ever popular Brass Band led Remembrance Sunday Parade, last year with approximately 250 residents in attendance.

We will be doing the same this year on Sunday 13th November.

To hold this event safely we close the roads that the parade route follows, at each of the junctions we need volunteer marshals to close the road when required and re-open it again when the all clear message is given. High-vis vests and radios are provided and we station two people at each junction. At the busier Junctions road-closure signs are used.

We are currently looking for at least 12 volunteer marshals. We require all volunteers to be over 18 and able to meet the physical demands of standing for a length of time and walking up to 1 mile.

The Remembrance Parade is always a popular event which brings together residents throughout Kilburn and is high in community spirit.

World Restart a Heart Day - 16th October

Sritish Heart

Started in 2017, this day is supported by The Resuscitation Council UK along with the

British Heart Foundation, British Red Cross, St John Ambulance, NHS Ambulance Service and Saving
Lives for Scotland to help raise awareness of cardiac arrest and teach CPR.

If you have an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest in the UK, you have less than a one in ten chance of surviving. This can be changed by making sure that as many people as possible know that when someone collapses and stops breathing normally, it is important to quickly call 999, perform hands-only CPR and use a defibrillator. This gives everyone the best chance of surviving.

Hands-only CPR reduces your risk of catching an infection, and without intervention it's unlikely the person in cardiac arrest will survive. Record numbers; In 2019, an amazing 291,000 were trained in CPR through Restart a Heart Day. On this day members of the public worldwide are encouraged to learn lifesaving skills such as CPR and how to use Defibrillators. In this article we are doing are bit as a Parish Council to raise awareness in our community, this information has been provided by the British Heart foundation and Resuscitation Council UK.

Kilburn Parish has 6 automated external defibrillators thought out our village purchased and maintained by the Parish Council this is to help save lives should there be an emergency.

Follow these short steps to learn how to save a life:

- Shout for help and shake the person gently
- Look and listen for signs of normal breathing
- Call 999 on loudspeaker and tell them the person isn't breathing. The ambulance call handler will tell you where the nearest automated external defibrillator (AED) is. If someone is with you, ask them to fetch it and bring it back
- Interlock your fingers and start chest compressions twice per second. Don't stop
- If a defibrillator arrives, switch it on and follow the instructions

Continue CPR until:

- The AED asks you to pause while it reanalyses and gives another shock if needed
- A paramedic arrives and tells you what to do
- The person shows signs of life

Enjoy your bonfire night celebrations safely

The advice given is to attend an organised events f you can rather than risking your safety by having your own bonfire or fireworks display. If you want to buy fireworks or have a bonfire for use in your garden, please follow the information below or visit the DirectGov website firework safety and bonfire safety for great safety Information.

Firework Safety

Fireworks

- Only buy fireworks with a CE mark. Don't buy fireworks from UNLICENCED retailers.
- Don't drink alcohol if you're setting off fireworks
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm
- Never put fireworks in your pocket
- Never go back to a lit firework unless the instructions advise otherwise
- Never throw fireworks; it is dangerous. Never throw spent fireworks on a bonfire
- Never give sparklers to a child under the age of 5
- Only buy fireworks that comply with current safety standards
- Always keep fireworks in a closed box. Take them out one at a time and close the box
- Always supervise children around fireworks
- Take care around open flames such as bonfires and barbecues. All clothes can catch fire
- Be considerate. Let your neighbours know you will be having a display
- Carefully follow the instructions on EACH firework. Light fireworks & sparklers one at a time at arm's length with suitable gloves, at the end of the fuse

Bonfires

- Should be at least 18 metres (60ft) away from houses, trees, hedges, fences or sheds
- Use domestic firelighters Never use petrol, paraffin or other flammable liquids

How do you keep animals safe on Bonfire Night?

- Walk your dog during daylight hours to avoid times when fireworks are likely to be set off
- Move your dog to the safe haven each evening before the fireworks begin. Provide toys and other things that they enjoy in the safe haven. Put on some music or TV to mask the sounds
- Make sure there are things for you to do too, so your dog isn't left alone
- Close windows and curtains to muffle the sound of fireworks. Blackout your doggy safe haven,
- Ignore the firework noises yourself. Play with a toy to see if your dog wants to join in, but don't force them to play
