# Report from Kilburn Parish Council – August/September 2023

At the Parish Council meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> June, Mr Stephen Turner was co-opted as a Member of the Council. There remain two vacancies – anybody wishing to join the Parish Council should get in touch with the Clerk.

The Police have been informed of parents parking their vehicles in Top Farm Court adjacent to the school(s). This is a private area and is only to be used by residents and visitors to Top Farm Court – the police will carry out enquiries.

The Parish Council has been asked to investigate property which appears to have been abandoned on Elm Tree Avenue. The Borough Council is also to investigate ownership.

A new editor of the Newsletter has been appointed – Lisa Varty. Lisa will let you know her contact details later in this edition.

A community working party continues to meet at the nature reserve and a great deal has been achieved. The Council has also asked the Rotary Club for assistance both financially and with manpower. The next meet up will be on August 12th. Anybody wishing to be involved should turn up at 9.30 am or for further details contact the Clerk.

If there is a resident who is willing to act as a co-ordinator for the Neighbourhood Watch – please would they contact the Clerk.

Several residents have come forward to volunteer for the Community Speedwatch. It is hoped that Speedwatch will commence very soon.

We are holding our annual garden competition as usual this year. Additional credits will be given to those gardens which support wildlife and nature. Presentation of prizes will be made at the Parish Council meeting in September.

We are pleased to say that the defibrillator which was thought to have been stolen has now been found. However, the cabinet has been damaged. It will be refitted (near to the Miners Welfare, Chapel St) as soon as possible.

The Council has also received complaints about derelict ground on Footpath 11 (opposite One Stop) where there is a lot of 'fly tipping'. The land is privately owned, and the Council will endeavour to find the owner.

The Council has been approached to find ways to make Chapel St a 'one way' system. The Council has applied to the Highways Authority several times, in the past, for this but it has been refused. The Council will try again. It is disappointing to hear that some residents are being very abusive, and we would ask that all be considerate of each other with regard to parked vehicles.

There is no meeting in August due to members holidays, the next meeting will be September the 4th 2023.

# You may recall

last year we your Parish Council sent out a community questionnaire. The aim of it was to collate current information that we could work with to the benefit of the parish and its growing community. It enabled the residents of Kilburn to have their say, positive and negative.

This was done with the aim of creating a new 5-year Parish Council Action Plan (PCAP), predominantly influenced by you. Identifying what the residents of Kilburn want to see in the future and what needs tackling as priority.

# What has been done?

There was plenty for us to reflect on, including a great deal of additional feedback for us to go through. Majority of feedback supported actions that we were already aware of and actively working towards. Some of which has already been achieved. We are pleased to report we have received positive feedback from our community and seen great outcomes. Some of these achievements have been reported recently in editions of this newsletter.

We are delighted to say that the data has now been fully researched, reviewed and documented. We are aiming to have the 5-year PCAP available for viewing at the end of August. This will be available on our website, notice boards, emailed on request and a Facebook post will also be done notifying you of its release.

# What will be done next?

In the upcoming editions of this newsletter there will be a section dedicated to the PCAP / Community Led Plan feedback. It will be done in question sections; giving you an informative collated overview of what, we the parish council received, what's being actioned and what is work in progress.

Our plan is to stay on track with the 5-year PCAP while also taking on-board current, ongoing requests from our community and we will continue to work in partnership with other local authorities, government bodies, local groups, new community ventures and other resources.

Your help and support in this project has been invaluable and greatly appreciated!

We, your parish councillors enjoy what we do and are proud of the opportunity we have been given to enhance Kilburn. We are all volunteers, and we greatly appreciate the support that we received from the community in this project, and we would appreciate your community support going forward with our plans. Without it we could not have done what we have or continue to do so.

# <u>County Councillor for Horsley Division - Cllr Trevor Ainsworth</u> Keeping you updated

Hello again, I hope that everyone is well and enjoying the warmer weather.

# <u>Roads</u>

I have our Highways Design team currently working on a design for the installation of a Pedestrian Refuge on the B6179 Derby Road. This is to be located around the area in close proximity to the JET Petrol Station area of Derby Road. The intention is this scheme will be designed for August 2023 with a view to being constructed later in the financial year. The location chosen is constrained to a degree by the available carriageway width on Derby Road as the minimum central island is 1.5m, but ideally you try to seek installation of a 1.8m or 2m wide central island to help provide a suitable refuge for vulnerable road users that allows people to feel safe in utilising the facility. In addition, you have to be careful in terms of where it is sited so that its presence does not impact on the associated turning circles for residential vehicles, HGVs with rigid and fixed axels.

As part of the assessment process we are looking to change the section through the built environment of Derby Road to 30 mph, it has been a difficult one as there are certain rules around the length of speed limits and how we can accommodate these constraints within Derby Road, but the legislation framework for the 'Setting of Local Speed Limits' does provide justification for the change to 30 mph through the built environment section tied in with the specified distances required to maintain an effective speed limit transition through Lower Kilburn. You will have the formal opportunity to raise your views at the statutory 21-day public notice part of the order process. If we do receive objections to the scheme, then these will be passed to the delegated Senior Officer at DCC who has the delegated powers to make the decision on the proposed order being implemented.

In addition to this we are also planning on replacing the existing Vehicle Activated Sign (40 mph Speed Limit reminder) on Derby Road with a NEW 30 mph one to support/supplement the proposed new 30 mph speed limit.

# **Transport**

The 138 bus service has been running now for over 6 months, I have recently asked for the patronage figures at each stop. This will enable us to adjust, if necessary, any changes along the route. I continue to lobby the officers of DCC who actually fund the service for improvements in regularity and route. Below I reiterate the details of two further services funded by DCC. I know that this information has been published in the past, but few people are using these services, if we do not use them, we will lose them.

The Derbyshire Connect Access to Health service . This provides a door-to-door service to heath related appointment e.g., doctors, hospital, dentists etc. All passengers are charged a fare dependent on the mileage travelled but the cost is lower than equivalent taxi fares. This service is operated by Ashbourne Community Transport under contract to the County Council. For more details on the service and to book a journey please call 01335 342951.

The Derbyshire Connect Weekly shopping bus service. This provides a once-a-week shopping trip from every community in the county to a local town centre and or supermarket to enable people to shop and etc for a couple of hours before returning passengers back to their home. Passengers with a Gold Card travel for free on this service with other passengers being charged a fare. In the Horsley Woodhouse area this service is provided by Derbyshire Community Transport under contract to the County Council. Work continued towards improvements such as: Hawthorne hedge planting using saplings that have self-seeded, upkeep of paths and edges by the clearing of unwanted weeds, repositioning /splitting of plants already established to create more abundance, creating wood piles for insect, trees preservation and the establishment of areas for compost heaps to be built using reclaimed wood.

# My first update

It is an honour to have been elected as one of your Councillors for Kilburn, Denby, Holbrook and Horsley ward of Amber Valley Borough Council in the May local elections. Thank you to those who voted for me. As I said to many people in the lead up to the election, I will represent all our residents whether they voted for me or not, so please do feel free to contact me with any casework issues you have.

## The Borough Council

The newly formed Borough Council held its first full council meeting on 24 May 2023. At that meeting Tony Holmes was elected as Mayor, (some of you may have met him at the Kilburn, Denby and Horsley Carnival), which I also attended and enjoyed very much. The full council meeting is open to the public, all are welcome, although seats are limited so you may need to arrive early!

The Cabinet held their first meeting on 28 June 2023. Cabinet meetings have been moved to the evening so that they are more accessible to the public. They are a great way of learning about the strategy and policy of the Council, and you can submit questions for the cabinet in advance of the meetings.

The various committees have also been set up. I have been appointed to the Licensing Committee and we held our first meeting on 14 June 2023, and I have been appointed at the Chair of the Standards and Appeals Committee. Our first meeting is on 5 July 2023. Committee meetings are also open to the public and dates can be found on the Amber Valley website.

I am a member of Kilburn and Horsley Parish Councils and so will be present at those meetings, but I will also attend the monthly meetings of Holbrook and Denby Parish Councils so that I can link-in with any issues, concerns, events, and good news stories that are discussed.

## **Surgeries**

I am in the process of arranging my surgeries and dates will shortly be published for these up until May 2024. I will be holding one surgery a month, at weekends and these will be held on a rotational basis within each of the parishes in the ward: Kilburn, Denby, Holbrook and Horsley. Once the dates are confirmed they will be published on the Amber Valley Borough Council website, and I will also include them in my updates here in Kilburn news. As a resident of the ward, you will be welcome to attend <u>any</u> surgery I hold, not just the one in Kilburn. The surgeries will be held on a drop-in basis initially but may move to an appointments-based system if they get busy. I look forward to meeting you there!

### Keeping Kilburn Scam Aware!

Around £40 million people have been targeted by scammers since January 2023, it was reported that £1.2 billion was lost to fraud in 2022 according to data released in May 2023, 14% increase compared to this time last year. Anyone can be the target or victim of fraud, I like to think of myself as Scam Savvy, but even I have been caught as some of these scams are quite elaborate. I myself have received a few dodgy texts and phone calls that could have resulted in me becoming a victim of fraud, but due to following certain groups and pages on social media I find it easier to spot a potential scam, but not everyone uses social media or has an internet connection.

The most common types of scams that are reported include:

- Deliveries, postal or courier services (55%)
- Someone pretending to be from the government or HMRC (41%)
- Someone offering a fake investment or financial 'get rich quick' schemes (29%)
- Rebates and refunds (28%)
- Banking (27%)
- Online shopping (24%)
- Health or medical (13%)
- Energy scams (12%)



Doorstep Scams where you are scammed on your very own doorstep by an unscrupulous fraudsters seem to happen more in the summer months, some of these scams include:

- The Nottingham Knockers also known as the 'Duster Sellers', these scammers are usually young men who purport to be ex-convicts who have just been released from prison. They knock on your door, usually carrying a large holdall or rucksack, full of cheap household cleaning items and goods, they tell you how the prison service has set up a scheme to help ex-convicts gain employment by selling these items to people on the doorstep, they even have professional looking ID cards. His Majesty's Prison Service have said there has never been any such program as this, nor are there any plans to set one up in the future. The dangers of engaging with a Nottingham Knocker or Duster Seller on your doorstep are that you will be ripped off, by buying Pound Shop Items for well above their retail price, some of those who have purchased from these sellers and 'paid in cash' on the doorstep have become victims of a household burglary shortly after engaging with the scammer, some vulnerable victims end up having weekly visits from these criminals, items for sale start form £10 but the prices escalate, week on week until the weekly price reaches £80 £100 or even much higher.
- Other doorstep scams include a stranger posing as a genuine trader, they tell you that they have spotted a loose tile on your roof or that your guttering needs repair, then they offer to fix it for an agreed price. Once you agree to this they pretend to carry out the repairs and tell you that actually more work needs doing, then they demand a substantial cash up front and have been known to accompany a victim to the nearest ATM to retrieve the funds, these types of scammers are known to be pushy and aggressive towards their victims. Once the cash is handed over, they never return to carry out said works and you are left out of pocket.

Some of these doorstep scammers can be very persuasive or become aggressive, don't be afraid to close your front door on them, if you feel threatened or at risk of danger in anyway, do not hesitate to call the police.

Telephone scams are a common way for fraudsters to try and obtain your personal information, they claim to be from your bank, a utility company, or a computer company. Here are some examples of current telephone scams:

• Someone claiming to be from your bank will call and tell you that there is a problem with your card or account. These callers sound professional, will try to convince you that your card has been cloned or that your money is at risk and have an air of urgency about them. They might ask for your bank account, card details and your PIN number, then offer to send a courier to collect your card. They could also advise transferring your money to a 'safe account' to protect it, this 'safe Account' will be one that they have set up to obtain your money. This is a common scam, and your bank would never ask you to any of the above.

Calls where fraudsters claim to be from the HMRC have been reported. The caller claims that there is an issue with your tax refund or an unpaid tax bill, they sometimes leave a message and ask you to call back. They call you to try and obtain your personal and bank details. The HMRC don't contact people via phone calls when such issues arise, they contact you via postal mail and would never call asking for your personal information.

You can avoid cold calls by registering with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS), this service might help you determine if a caller is legitimate or not as the TPS allows people to opt-out of marketing calls, businesses who make such calls would see that your on the TPS list and avoid calling you. If you think a caller is fraudulent, don't give out any personal details and report them to Action Fraud UK.

Text Scams, Mobile App Scams and cases of online fraud are also on the rise, anyone who owns a mobile phone or computer can be a target for these kinds of fraudsters. Common Scams include:

The loved one in need scam, you could receive a text or WhatsApp message supposedly from a family member (usually a child), saying that they have lost their phone and are using a friends phone or that they have gotten a new phone number because they couldn't afford to pay their bill and need money urgently for this and other bills. These messages usually start with 'Hello mum' or 'Hello dad' they will then provide some bank details for you to transfer money across to them. If you suspect you may be a target of this scam, call your child or the person the message purports to be from.

**Parcel Delivery Scams**, these texts, and emails purport to be from a legitimate courier company such has UPS, Royal mail, or FedEx. They claim that you have missed a delivery of a parcel/package and must pay a small amount of money to rearrange and receive delivery of the parcel/package. The text will contain a link, if you click on this link you are taken to a fake website that looks very convincing and are asked to input your bank details, the fraudster then has your bank details, and this could leave you at risk of theft from your bank account.

You can report malicious and fraudulent texts by forwarding them 7726.

**Tammy Barnes**, Derbyshire Constabularies' **Fraud Assessment and Protect Officer** said: "The impact fraud and scams have on its victims can be devastating, we take all reports seriously and we are always looking for ways raise awareness of how to protect yourself from it.

"If you know how to identify a scam, and more importantly how to keep yourself safe from it, you are less likely to become a victim or suffer a loss.

"Some victims have said they feel embarrassed at 'falling' for a scam, but there is nothing to be embarrassed about as people of all ages and backgrounds are susceptible to different types of scams which are carried out by professional fraudsters."

She added: "Be conscious that not everyone, whether at your door, on the phone or online, is who they claim to be. Remember to stop- take five minutes and don't be pressured into taking action; think- does this request make sense, are they asking for money or personal information; and tell- speak to a trusted relative or friend and ask their advice."





So last night just as I was finishing up putting this newsletter together, I went to get a cuppa. When I went to fill the kettle, I noticed my water pressure was really low, then after a short while my taps ran dry. I was in a little bit of a panic as I have medication I needed to take, and I didn't have any drinks in that could substitute a glass of water.

I went online and visited the Severn Trent Water website, they informed me that a pipe had burst on Chapel Street, but engineers were on the job (they are very good at keeping you updated on line), a short while after this I saw a friend had posted about the same issue on social media and someone else commented that they needed their water for medical issues and didn't know what to do, so I did a little digging and discovered that just like the national grid and our power supply companies, Severn Trent also has a Priority Services Register, so I passed the details on.

A Priority Services Register is there to ensure that vulnerable people will have their utility services restored as soon as possible and that they are supported with an alternative power or gas supply if needed or supplied an alternative source of water.

You are eligible to apply to be on the Priority Services Register if you are:

- Are over 65.
- Have a disability or long-term illness.
- Rely on medical equipment in your home.
- Families with children aged 5 and under (less than 6 years old)
- Have gone through a recent bereavement, break-up, or job loss.
- Are recovering from a hospital treatment.
- Are living independently for the first time.
