Our next meeting will be held on Monday 13th June at 7.00pm. Residents are welcome to attend. At the meeting held on 9th May Cllr David Hall was re-elected as Chairman with Cllr David Earnshaw re-elected as Vice Chairman. Two vacancies exist on the Council – please contact the Clerk for further details.

The Parish Council continues with its efforts to take ownership of Fairview Play area which has been decommissioned. The company who own the land has gone into receivership and the land has been returned to the crown.

The Council will write to the ‘Crown’ solicitors and also request Nigel Mills MP to assist. We anticipate that it will take some time to turn this area into a community garden.

Complaints have been received with regard to the condition of the nature reserve. Members of the Council will visit regularly to ensure the reserve remains tidy. A contractor will be asked to attend to trim certain areas.

We still await news about our bid for funding to enable the work on the nature reserve to be complete. We will keep residents informed about the bid and ongoing work via the newsletter, website & Facebook.

The Parish Council has indicated to Derbyshire County Council that it wishes to be included in a ‘trial’ to place traffic speed indicator signs in various locations in Kilburn – these locations include Ryknield Rd., Elmtree Avenue & Woodhouse Rd. Shortlisting for the annual garden competition will take place towards the end of July with the Mayor of Amber Valley Borough Council carrying out the final judging soon after.

Residents have requested that a gate, part way down the footpath known as Pitfields (runs to the side of the old Chip shop on Chapel St) be reinstated in order to prevent horses and motorbikes using the footpath. Derbyshire County Council has previously been informed of the problem and are currently making an investigation.

We are pleased to announce that agreement has been made with the Baptist Church on Highfield Rd that a joint Charity Community Carol Service will be held on the evening of Friday 9th December 2022 in the Baptist Church. Further details will be given nearer the time.

You will see from articles in this Newsletter with regard to a Community Led Plan, Neighbourhood Watch & a joint Facebook page with the Community Association that Members of the Council have been working hard. We would urge residents to complete the questionnaire which comes with the newsletter to enable the Parish Council to know the wishes of residents.

A Message From Cllr Trevor Ainsworth

We have all witnessed the terrible state of some of the grass verges in the village.

We may also have seen the lovely wildflower meadow verge's on our travels around the county and surrounding villages and how wonderful it looks, full of colour and obviously a great home for insects and a brilliant feeding ground for bees, an oasis surrounded by Tarmac.

Have you ever thought about adopting and maintaining the grass verge outside your home?

It does not have to be a meadow that you plant it can be any low lying foliage or just kept as a lovely piece of manicured lawn, which looks great but is not so good for the Bees and other insects.



To do this you require a licence from the County council who are Highways Authority. As always there is a form to complete but on this occasion at no cost other than your time.

There are a set of rules on the application form, here is a summary of some of them.

- No shrubs or plants which are of a poisonous nature shall be planted, any planting shall be maintained in a way which will not affect road users.
- The growing of vegetables is not allowed.
- You cannot plant trees or erect fencing; you may not use any pesticides.

You will also need to provide a sketch plan or marked photograph which indicates clearly the area and dimensions and nature of the planting. Also a small map of the area which shows the location in relation to neighbours.

If the rules have not put you off e mail; highways.hub@derbyshire.gov.uk for an application form. Or if you are not great with I.T contact me and ill get paper copy sent to your home.

Once they have received your application they are referred to Officers in Maintenance, Traffic & Safety and Development Control who will have a look and satisfy themselves they are happy with what is proposed.

Neighbourhood Watch is back!



In April we were proud to launch the New Kilburn Parish Council Neighbourhood Watch.

This is a critical part of the parish councils' commitment to the safety of our community and tackling antisocial behaviour.

Our strength will be building a strong network of residents throughout Kilburn, to share relevant information safely and efficiently.

What is and isn't the Neighbourhood Watch?

Having been around since 1982, The Neighbourhood Watch is the largest crime prevention voluntary movement in England and Wales and has upwards of 2.3 million members.

The scheme encourages members of the community to take ownership of local initiatives and support one another to feel safe in their homes and local area.

The Neighbourhood Watch is not about curtain twitching or spying on our neighbours. It strongly discourages vigilantism and is not about individuals patrolling the streets or tackling crime directly – that is a job best left for the police.

Being part of Neighbourhood Watch can:

- ✓ Reduce/prevent local crime and disorder;
- ✓ Reduce fear of crime;
- ✓ Address issues relating to antisocial behaviour;
- ✓ Build community spirit and cohesion amongst all age groups;
- ✓ Create safer neighbourhoods;
- ✓ Reassure members of the public;
- ✓ Enhance partnership working with other community groups;
- ✓ Assist in the detection and apprehension of criminals;
- ✓ Improve the quality of life for members;
- ✓ Improve the local environment.

What's new this time?

The new Kilburn Neighbourhood Watch will be an integral part of the Parish Councils focus on understanding and reducing antisocial behaviour and crime in our area.

Coordination of this program will not only support live and accurate information being made available to all Kilburn residents but it will also enable us to get hands on in the sharing of key concerns with our local PCSO whilst championing the areas which require focus.

The Neighbourhood Watch will provide us with a range of ready-made toolkits which we will utilise to make Kilburn safer. The new Neighbourhood Watch has been adopted by the entire Parish Council and we look forward to developing the program.

Will there be a revival of the Facebook page?

The Parish Council have been working closely with the Kilburn Community Association to develop a Facebook page that will support all Kilburn's social media needs, this page will serve as a one-stop-shop to get all your Kilburn village updates from the Parish Council, Community Association and Neighbourhood Watch. On joining you will be in control of your level of involvement, and choose alerts to match your interests e.g. only local matters, wider Derbyshire information, cyber security warnings. 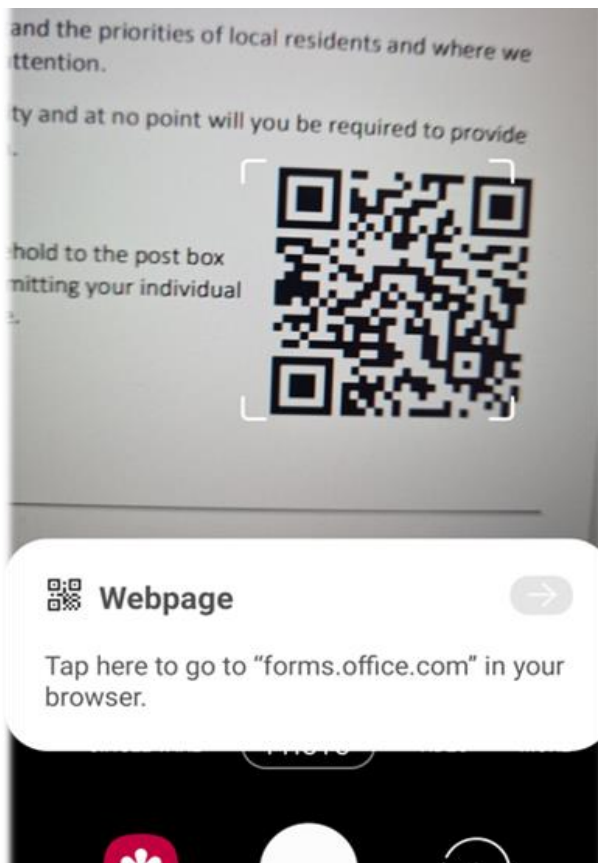


What is a QR code



QR codes are a type of barcode that can be recognised by a camera and converted into an instruction for your device (mobile phone, tablet etc), often this instruction might be to take you to a website, send a message or fill in a password (normally from the bottom of the WIFI router etc). They are designed to make your life easier by giving your device specific instructions and saving you time.

The Kilburn Parish Council is starting to utilise QR codes more, you will find a QR code on the questionnaire that will soon be arriving through your door, this will allow you to fill in your responses instantly online, rather than manually filling in and returning the questionnaire. QR codes will also be used in the upcoming “Walk Through The Past” project, telling the stories of Kilburn’s past at landmarks throughout the village.



How to use QR codes

Most modern smart phones have the software built into the camera app now so you simply need to open the camera and point it towards the QR code, the camera should then recognise the QR code and offer to take you to the link, which you can then just simply click on.

If this doesn't work, check your device camera settings to ensure that the preferences allow the use of QR codes.

Still not working? You can try installing a specific QR reader app from your app store.

Tip - Make sure when choosing an external app to only pick one which has plenty of good reviews.

Alternatively, it might be worth Googling why the QR reader is not working on your specific device, this will give you a more direct answer and hopefully help fix the problem quickly.

The Kilburn Community led plan of 2011-2021 outlined the hopes and aspirations that the residents of Kilburn wanted to see happen over the years, it was created to help Improve the quality of life for the local community.

Our thanks

These are Kilburn Parish Councillors and Councillors, Amber Valley Borough Council, Kilburn Infants and Junior School, Steering Group Members, Rural Action Derbyshire and the residents of Kilburn.

We also acknowledge the involvement, time and effort that continues as we still strive to achieve the key request set out.

Commemorating success and plans moving forward

The current Parish Council Working Party have dug deep into the KCLP 2011-2021 and have gone through the key points of action. We are proud to say that a lot has already been accomplished.

In this article they have identified and will share **some** of key areas from the KCLP that have been completed so far, items ongoing that need further time and work also what we are currently doing to help and improve our parish based on new requests that have arisen since this time.

The key areas that we'd like to mention have been broken down into 5 categories.

1. Environment

It was proposed that we should improve the overall look of the village, this has been achieved in numerous ways.

We would like to mention our thanks to the Parish Warden. He has been working for the Parish for a long time and has been key in the upkeep of the village.

We will continue to employ a Parish Warden and to make improvements, recently we have put into place a new co-managed support structure to help maintain a positive, safe, and productive working schedule.

The War memorial and surrounding area has recently been renovated and we will continue to look after and maintain it.

There has been five planters and 36 lamppost floral displays placed around the village. You may have seen we hold an annual garden competition for residents to get involved in. We think this is beneficial as it helps contribute to the village's appearance and community spirits. For the same reason, we also carry out village clean ups, by organising and supporting community litter picks.

It is important to mention that it was residents that wanted an increase in dog litter bins and bags dispensers. Four new dog bag dispensers have been installed and we stock them regularly; we have also added five new litter bins around the village.

We aim to continue to improve and upkeep the overall look of the village by maintaining and supporting ideas such as dog bag dispensers, bins, planters, continuing to do community events and importantly discussing any requests or comments we receive.

2. Community

It was proposed that we promote a welcoming village. We have done this by adding planters with new signage with the Kilburn Village Crest at Kilburn boundaries, these we continue to maintain.

It was also mentioned that we help establish a community newsletter, this has been done with success. We create a community newsletter regularly and now employ an editor and we engage with volunteers who kindly deliver the newsletters. We will continue to monitor and develop it, so you receive an informative newsletter with useful and fun content.

We have also launched the Parish Council Website which we will continue to improve and update when necessary. Recently we have had a wonderful union with Kilburn Community Association. We are delighted to be joining Facebook with them, sharing their page.

You will find out more about this in an article on page 8 of this newsletter.

We hope having a newsletter, notice board information, website, and now a Facebook page we can provide better, current, and more wide ranged means of communication regarding; important information, useful contact details, news about events taking place in Kilburn village and highlighting what is being offered at the Village Hall.

Regarding community events we organise and run with volunteers the Remembrance Day Memorial Service and Christmas Carol Service this will continue.

We also give our support by working closely with Kilburn Community Association and helping the formation of any new community ventures that arise. At present we are supporting the new venture 'A walk through the past' which will be placed around the village to promote and provide information about our local history.

It is important to add that we will continue to encourage and support the formation of new clubs, groups, run annual events and help existing clubs the best we can.

3. Facilities and Amenities

It was asked that there be upgrades to every recreational play area. Four out of the five play areas in the area were completed the fifth one has been closed by AVBC, which we are currently working towards purchasing, to transform into a community garden with the help and contribution of volunteers.

It was also requested that we look at ways to provide facilities for the use of youth and young people. This was established with the completion of the multiuse park by the Kilburn welfare. This request was also kept in mind when plans were made for improvement of the nature reserve - memorial garden, this will have areas for children's activities. We are working hard to accomplish this by way of applying for funding and managing the project. It is being achieved in stages; stage one has been completed.

We keep monitoring and reporting any broken or damaged play equipment that is noticed and we contact local authorities that are responsible. If we receive information from residents regarding problems with play areas, this goes onto an agenda and is discussed in a Parish Council meeting, so we can seek a resolution to a problem.

4. Security and Safety

It was proposed that in relation to the security and safety of the village it was important that we maintain police presence within the village.

Since the KCLP, Kilburn Parish Council have kept up communication and relationships with Derbyshire Constabulary and our Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's)

During lockdown, to tackle rising issues in the village and to have our concerns heard, we invited the, at the time, Derbyshire Police Commissioner to a zoom meeting with us. Because of this we have seen some positive changes around the village, and we had an increase of presence from our PCSO's. They attended more of our meetings and they have held a 'cuppa with a coppa' meeting at the village hall.

We continue to monitor any village issues and will request more meetings with the police if necessary.

Last year we formed an Antisocial Behaviour Working Party (ASB) within the Parish Council. It was formed because we were aware of issue's mounting in our parish.

We had raised these reported issues with our PCSO's however we were wanting to help and support residents practically. Forming the Working Party improved our ability to focus our research and gain a better understanding of ASB and its impact.

This led to an article being produced that went into our newsletter. It gave supportive Information for those being affected. The Working Party will also continue and meet regularly to discuss and help with issues raised by residents.

It was stated that the hedgerows, shrubs, and trees do have an impact upon personal safety when walking around the village.

To help with this we employ a warden and own the necessary equipment to deal with some problems. We rely on matters being reported to us, but we also voluntarily walk the village and check. If a problem is not under our parish jurisdiction, we will contact the relevant authorities to deal with it.

In April we had a meeting with the head of the Derbyshire Neighbourhood Watch team. With our support this scheme is now running under the title of Kilburn Parish Neighbourhood Watch, we will be supporting this and looking into ways of improvement.

5. Traffic and transport

It was requested that we had a pedestrian crossing, this has been done. A crossing was constructed by Kilburn School. There have also been pavements lowered and bubble pavements instated.

Another point that was mentioned was exploring ways to calm traffic and limit a “rat run” through the village. We have helped this by actively supporting our Community Speed Watch and Derbyshire CREST team.

We are also working with Denby Parish Council, this is a joint undertaking, as both parishes contributed to purchase the equipment that was needed.

To keep momentum going and because members had left, we organised in March a meeting with Denby Parish Council, Derbyshire CREST team and interested volunteers. It was very successful, there are now two new coordinators one from each parish and several new volunteers from both parishes.

Everyone will be working together supporting each other’s parish during this new venture.

Whilst working back through the KCLP, we recognised that there are traffic issues that have got worse over time as more people have cars.

We have noted these issues and have started to work on them.

We look forward to receiving your responses so we can create a new plan going forward helping us work proactively towards what the residents of Kilburn want to see in the future.

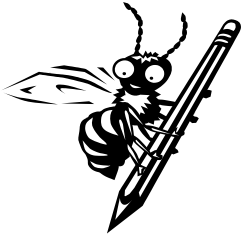

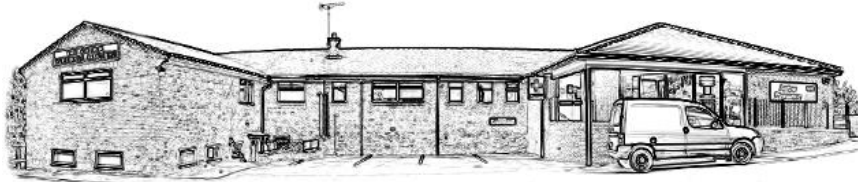

Who can use the service?

Anyone who lives in Derbyshire (outside Derby City) or is registered with a GP in Derbyshire and has limited support from family or friends.

What sort of help does the service offer?

- Undertaking simple shopping
- Making sure the home environment is warm and comfortable
- Arranging for key safes to be fitted and community alarm or telecare systems to be provided if needed
- Supporting people to pay bills and make appointments
- Collecting medication prescriptions
- Helping people to find out about and access community activities to keep them connected to their communities
- Helping people to understand care options and plan what they need for the future
- Signposting people to other statutory, voluntary sector and community organisations as appropriate.
