We will remember them...

Thank you to everyone who joined our Remembrance Day Parade on Sunday 13th November 2022.

As always Kilburn delivered an excellent turnout with over 250 attending to watch the parade be led by Newstead Brass Band. Following the service at the War Memorial a Church Service was held in the Baptist Church.











Our next meeting will be held on Monday 12th December at 7.00pm. Residents are welcome to attend.

The annual Remembrance Day parade and service returned to 'normal' this year following the Covid epidemic. The parade, led by Newstead Brass Band included children from the local scouting groups together with members of the Parish Council and the public. A short service including the Act of Commitment was held at the War Memorial followed by a service in the Baptist Church. The Parish Council would like to thank everybody who enabled the event to take place including the many marshalls who manned the access roads to the village. Without such support this annual event would not be able to take place.

A reminder that a Carol Service will take place on Friday 9th December at 6.30pm in the Baptist Church, Highfield Rd. Owing to other events taking place in Kilburn it has been necessary to move both date and location for the Carol Service. Please help us make this a joyful and happy event in these challenging times. Refreshments will be served following the service. Due to the change of location the Christmas lights will be switched on prior to the Carol Service on the 1st December.

Darren Belfield will be commencing as the new Parish Warden on 1st December – initially Darren will be working 18 hours a week which will be kept under review. Please stop and 'have a chat' with Darren when you see him. We know everybody will make him welcome.

Update on progress with work on the Nature Reserve – please see the separate request for residents to form a working party in March 2022 to tidy up the nature reserve.

Community Speedwatch has applied for additional locations around the village but is having difficulty in obtaining a response but will keep pursuing. Speedwatch will mostly operate at weekends during the winter due to the dark evenings and safety concerns.

The Parish Council has been working tirelessly to put mobile speed traffic signs around the village. The application to the County Council is in its final stage and the Speed Indicator Sign (SID) is ready to be installed therefore, hopefully, the SID will be operating on Ryknield Rd initially.

The Parish Council has asked DCC/Highways to reinstate the 'no waiting' restriction on Highfield Rd. This restriction enables vehicles to pull in to let vehicles pass. (Currently there is no sign but the yellow line remains.) DCC have agreed to 'look into' the request but have stated it will take a long time due to other Highway demands. The Parish Council is running a poll on their Facebook page – if you wish to see the 'no waiting' restriction reinstated.

As this will be the last Newsletter for 2022 – the Parish Council would like to thank all of our volunteers who help distribute the Newsletter again, without this support it wouldn't be possible to publish and distribute a Newsletter.

We wish all residents a Happy Christmas and a healthy and wonderful New Year.

Yuk!

Unfortunately some people in our community are wearing blinkers when walking their dogs and do not notice their pooch going to the toilet on our paths, parks and grass verges. Naturally dogs need to "go" but when the mess is not picked up it is extremely unpleasant and a health concern which is why it is illegal under The Dogs Fouling of Land Act 1996. The penalty for not clearing up after your dog is a fixed penalty notice of £75, or a maximum fine of £1000 if prosecuted in the magistrate's court.



Fortunately the vast majority of residents in Kilburn are responsible dog owners, which makes it all the more frustrating when a small few let the village down. What everyone can do to aid this situation is report any offences to Amber Valley Borough Council.

Amber Valley will issue fixed penalty notices on a witness statement. A witness could be a neighbour or a complete stranger.

Reporting Dog Fouling

If you wish to make a complaint regarding dog fouling, please contact the helpline on 01773 841335 or submit the form on the website www.ambervalley.gov.uk/ environment/dog-control/dog-fouling/. They aim to respond to your complaint within 5 working days which will include patrols and erecting signage where appropriate.

Any information you supply will remain confidential.

It can also be very useful if a diary is kept on dates, times and brief descriptions etc. This can assist the wardens when patrolling the area.

Information to jot down—

- Where did this incident take place?
- What time/date did this incident take place?
- Name of the dog owner (if known)?
- Description of the dog owner and/or the dog?

Photos are extremely help but please do not put yourself at risk by getting into any confrontation, your witness statement alone is valuable.

By individuals taking actions and reporting dog fouling anonymously we can tackle the problem and take action against those who are letting us all down.

Did you know that the Kilburn Parish Council provides free poo bags throughout key points of the village to ensure that owners are able to pick up after their pets. Approx 32,000 bags are distributed each year, costing around £900. We appreciate that the bags provided are excellent quality and very useful but please only take what you need whilst exercising your pet and leave the remaining bags for the next person.

Through the responses from the Community Questionnaire, The Parish Council discovered that a great deal of residence value the Nature Reserve – Memorial area and appreciate the improvements that have been completed so far and are looking forward to it being finished.

A great deal has been done to make the area better. Priority was safety and stability of the trees and shrubs due to disease and overgrowth, along with improvements to accessibility due to uneven footpaths. The Parish Council are continuing to work hard to seek further funding and donations for future enhancements that need completing.

Unfortunately, due to the current economic climate it is proving very difficult to obtain funds, but they remain committed.

GOOD NEWS IS: There are things that can be done with little or no money that can help improve the use, overall upkeep and look of this area.

YOU CAN HELP

The Parish Council are wanting to put together a team of volunteers that can help tidy up, clear and improve the top area of the Nature Reserve - Memorial Area.

They are aiming to start this in **March 2023.**

This will involve clearing unwanted weeds, shrubbery, moving bark chip, generally clearing up and making good anything that is found that can be done.

This will be a community venture and once they know this is possible, the Parish Council will go ahead and put together a tidy up plan which they will work on with the team. They are also hopeful that this team may consider helping again in the future.

Cllr Trevor Ainsworth Keeping you updated

Hi All

We have been having some issues with pedal cycles and horses using footpath 74 at Kilburn and 72 at Denby, this runs from Chapel street Kilburn by the side of the Kilburn Chippy to Danesby Crescent. If you see anyone riding a horse or a cycle on the paths could you please let me know, so that we can supply the facts to Derbyshire County Council.

I can confirm that we have Highway Improvement Schemes for the B6179 Derby Road, Lower Kilburn. It consists of two schemes within one programme.

The scheme is in this year's programme which ends in April next year. We are essentially looking to install a Pedestrian Refuge as one element of the scheme to provide a safe and suitable crossing point over the B6179 and the secondary element is to provide a revised 30mph speed limit through a section of the existing 40mph limit and then introduce a Vehicle Activated Sign to support this change in the speed limit.

You may have also noticed that new lighting is being put in place on the same road but in Horsley patch.

Public consultation on £1.14bn devo deal to begin in November

public consultation about the East Midlands devolution deal is due to take place from 14 November 2022 until 9 January 2023.

Derbyshire County Council, Nottinghamshire County Council, Derby City Council, and Nottingham City Council have all given the green light to a public consultation on devolution, so the public, businesses, community

groups and other organisations will all have the chance to have their say about the deal.

The deal would provide the region with a guaranteed income stream of £38 million per year over a 30-year period, and would cover around 2.2 million people, making it one of the biggest in the country. It would also mean a new regional mayor and new type of combined authority for the area, from 2024.

Interested to know more about Derbyshire Toy Libraries, then read on as a recent finalist at the What's On For Kids 2022 awards, Founder, Ann-Marie McMillan answers some frequently asked questions.

Who are Derbyshire Toy Libraries?

It's a good question. Let us tell you all about ourselves. Derbyshire Toy Libraries in many ways is much like any other library; you can become a member, visit us and browse the shelves and borrow items for a period on loan. However it isn't books that are stocked on our shelves but toys, toys, toys.

DTL offers a wide range of services for communities across Derbyshire with the aim of providing a safe and welcoming place for families to come together and for children to develop through play.

Is DTL registered with The Charity Commission?

Yes, we are registered with The Charity Commission (Charity Number 1081255).

So how does it work?

Again, another good question. We have hundreds of toys available to hire, including baby toys, books, games, puzzles, ride-ons, sensory resources, dressing up and soft play. With so much choice you might be wondering where to start - our **Click and Browse** slots are the answer - during a 10 minute pre-booked appointment, Toy Library Members can come and look around the store and our Click and Collect Coordinator can give advice on the suitability of toys.

Our catalogue of toys and resources has over 1000 toys with new items being regularly added. It is available to browse online. After taking a look you've found a toy you'd like to hire, then use our handy **Click and Collect** service to place an order via our Facebook page and book your collection slot. Prices to hire start at 50p per week. Collection is from The Strutt Centre in Belper at pre-arranged times on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

Once you have joined as a member you can hire as many toys as you like, for as long as you like meaning that once your child has lost interest in a toy, you can return it and hire something different, saving you money and extending the life of the toys by reducing the number of items that end up in landfill.

Party Packages are also available to hire, we have standard sets that include soft play equipment, ride on toys, ball pits, slides and we can work with you to create a bespoke kit. Hire for as long as you need and return when you've finished - there is something for every occasion and venue whether, celebrating at home or at a function room or community venue

Membership of the Toy Library is £10 p/year with a 20% discount for signing up for recurring membership. Cost should never be a barrier to a child's development so message us and we can provide confidential advice about discounted support we can provide.

2022 has been a busy year for us. As well as celebrating our 22nd Birthday we have extended our range to include the hire of **reusable tableware kits**. We have 4 kits (6 settings per kit) which include; plates, bowls, beaker and cutlery. Each kit is conveniently boxed and you can add additional items to your hire, such as jugs, serving platters, extra bowls. Get in touch to discuss your requirements and add a tableware kit to a party pack hire.

I think my little one may be too young for toys?

You are never too young to join the Toy Library. Our **Purposeful Play Packs** packs are specifically aimed at little ones under 1. We have different packs available from birth to 3 months, 3-6 months, 6-9 and 9-12. Take a look at the website for more information on each pack.

Do you hold play sessions?

Absolutely, our **Stay and Play sessions** are the perfect opportunity for your child to play with other children and develop essential skills such as communication and learning to take turns and share.

Sessions run weekly in Belper on Wednesdays and Kilburn on Thursdays (term time only). Come along, meet other parents, enjoy a coffee whilst your little one's explore the wide range of toys we have available. Each session ends with songtime. Sessions cost £4 and last 90 minutes.

No need to book or be a member - just come along - all the details are on our website www.derbyshiretoylibraries.org

I'm starting to think about presents for Christmas, how can DTL help?

Arthur Medical Centre Update

Like almost all general practices, Arthur Medical Centre has been experiencing a greatly increased level of patient demand for appointments and services which unavoidably causes delays to patients' access to routine appointments. Feedback received from our Clinical and Reception teams is that the current level of demand, especially for 'on-the-day' appointments, is becoming unmanageable in terms of the significant impact on workload, and unsafe in terms of our teams' ability to deliver appropriate care. This situation is not unique to our practice.

The British Medical Association recently reported that "In August, practices in England delivered 3 million more appointments than in the same month in 2019".

Following a study related to our appointments and services, we have identified that the majority of patient demand appears to be for 'on-the-day' appointments. Often, the number of appointments or patient contacts that clinicians conduct in the practice is significantly greater than maximum safe levels recommended by the British Medical Association and Local Medical Councils. Arthur Medical Centre is therefore adapting the way we deliver our services and appointments from the 7th of November 2022, to reflect changes in patient demand, whilst safeguarding our teams' ability to provide safe and appropriate levels of care.

What is changing?

- From November, we will begin to transition our appointment system towards offering more of our appointments to as 'on-the-day' face-to-face and telephone appointments, which will increase our short-term capacity to reflect the majority of our patient demand. We aim for full implementation of the new system from 5th December 2022.
- The remaining portion of appointments will remain as 'pre-bookable' face-to-face and telephone consultations for routine matters.
- We are also increasing the overall ratio of face-to-face patient appointments.
- When our appointments are fully booked for the day, you will be asked to call NHS 111 for
 assistance or treatment. NHS 111 will then refer you to the most appropriate treatment route for
 your problem. These options will include referral to your local pharmacy, a local urgent treatment
 centre or wound clinic, or other appropriate solution.

How you can help us

- When you contact Arthur Medical Centre, please be considerate and kind when speaking with our Reception Team. Our team do their best to provide the best care possible to you within their resources and a difficult interaction with a patient can often have an emotional impact on the member of staff, which then affects how they are able to help other patients.
- If you are advised that our appointments are full on the day you call, please understand that this is not a personal rejection, but simply that the Practice's capacity within which we can safely deliver care, is now full due to demand from other patients.

- If you are unable to make an appointment that you have booked, please contact us to let us know as soon as possible to enable us to offer this appointment to other patients. In October 2022, **140** appointments, equating to approximately **35** hours of clinical time was wasted due to patients failing to attend without notice.
- All of the staff at Arthur Medical Centre strive to deliver an exceptional level of care to each and
 every patient, and we do so within the parameters of available resources and funding. If you have
 feedback or a complaint regarding your experience as a patient of the Practice, please submit this
 in writing for the attention of the Practice Manager. If you have feedback or a complaint regarding
 national policies related to Primary Care or NHS services, these may be best raised with your MP.

Changes to prescribing medication which is available to buy over the counter (OTC)

As a practice we continually monitor our prescribing to ensure that our patients receive the treatment which is the most medically appropriate for their illness or condition.

In March 2018, NHS England published guidance about reducing the prescribing of medicines or treatments that are available to buy over the counter (OTC). Arthur Medical Centre have adopted this guidance aiming to make all local people more "self-care aware".

We encourage all patients to take simple steps to help manage minor illnesses and injuries at home.

This means that we will be no longer providing you with medication that can be purchased over the counter

The "self-care" section https://joinedupcarederbyshire.co.uk/stay-well/#u has lots of information and advice on treating minor health problems with self-care.

By keeping certain useful medicines at home you can treat common conditions immediately and you won't need to see a GP. The medicines you may want to keep at home include:

- A painkiller to help treat minor conditions associated with pain, discomfort and fever.
- Indigestion medicines, oral rehydration salts and treatments for constipation and diarrhoea.
- Treatments for seasonal conditions such as colds and hay fever.
- Sunblock and after sun.

We believe that empowering people with the information and confidence to look after themselves gives people greater control of their own health. It will also help to reduce the number of GP consultations, enabling GPs to focus on caring for higher risk patients, such as those with multiple illnesses, the very young and the elderly.

Please feel free to speak to your local pharmacist who has the knowledge and skills to advise on the most appropriate treatment for you.
