Community Speedwatch

Kilburn & Denby Neighbourhood Watch and Kilburn Parish Council and potentially Denby Parish Council are looking to work in partnership with Derbyshire Constabulary to set a Community SpeedWatch group up in the parishes. With this in mind, we currently require volunteers to help with the scheme.

The aim is that those who are caught speeding are sent a formal letter from Derbyshire Constabulary advising them that they are breaking the law and providing an explanation of what could be done to prosecute motorists should they be repeatedly caught. We hope that this in turn will make the roads into, out of and around Kilburn safer for both road users and pedestrians. The parish council has had several reports of fly tipping across the parish over recent months.

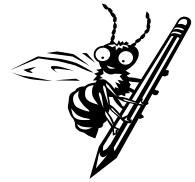

If you see someone fly tipping make a note of:

- The date, time and place
- How many people are involved and what they look like
- What has been tipped - how much and what it looks like
- The details of any vehicles involved including make, colour and registration number if possible
- Remember - **never** approach anyone you see fly tipping - they could become violent.

We have had a very busy beginning to the Spring term, with the children all crossing their fingers and waiting for snow! Our exciting news is our very first Infant visit to the seaside in July – Anderby Creek! We will be focussing our fundraising on trying to provide this visit at no cost to the children, so that all of them can attend, with no financial barriers to all parents. We are asking local companies and individuals for donations to help support this – huge thanks to ‘Kilburn Welfare & Social Club’ for £250, and the ‘Metro Stores’ for £250!! Our School Council will be organising fundraising activities to buy bucket and spades, and real ice-creams at the seaside!

Our classes have all started their new half-termly learning themes, with ‘Memorable Experiences’ including a ‘Messy, Mucky Laboratory’ and a visit from an animal handling workshop with meercats and lizards!

We will be holding our annual ‘School Safety Week’, with all children taking part in ‘National Safer Internet Day’, and also learning about safety and ‘choices’ for Water, Electricity, Roads and Strangers. We will have an NSPCC themed assembly, ‘Be Bold. Speak Out’, and have a fundraising day to help their important work. We will finish this half term thinking about ‘Anti-Bullying’ and wearing odd socks for a day with the theme ‘All equal but different’.

Last term children learnt about Diwali, Hannukah, Remembrance Day, and Christmas, and ‘Christians in Derbyshire Schools’ came to lead assemblies with us. We also thought about communities and helping others by taking part in activities for ‘Jeans for Genes’, and ‘Save the Children Christmas Jumper Day’, and by making Harvest and Christmas food collections for the local food bank charity, ‘Hope for Belper’. Our School Council organised a fundraising ‘Great Kilburn Big Bake Off’ event for ‘Children in Need’.

As part of our learning for ‘British Values’ we held a Year 2 ‘Election’ at the same time as the national General Election! Year 2 children wrote their ‘Election promises’, made ‘Vote for Me’ signs and spoke to children and parents in the playground before school. They were very brave to talk to all of the children and parents in the school hall before we all voted in our secret Ballot Box. The winner of the vote to be ‘Prime Minister of KINS’ was Sophie, who wanted to have Mrs Baillie’s office!!

For Parents and carers we held a Parents Evenings, ‘Celebration Assemblies’, and invited them into see children’s work at the end of half terms. First LEGO League City Shaper 2019

Back in December, a group of our year six pupils participated in the FIRST LEGO League City shaper competition at Nottingham University.



The competition is designed to engage students in hands-on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) experiences, enabling them to build confidence, grow their knowledge and develop habits of learning. FIRST LEGO League is built around theme-based challenges to engage children in research, problem solving, coding, and engineering.

During the competition, the children were required to design, build, test and program robots using LEGO® MINDSTORMS® technology and research challenges facing today's scientists.

They were also required to develop critical thinking, team-building, and presentation skills in solving real-world problems.

Despite competing against 8 other secondary schools, our team of budding designers, programmers and presenters finished in first place, progressing to the National Final in Bristol in February.



Christmas Charity

A group of thirty lower school children visited Kilburn Residential Home to spread the magic of Christmas.

The children sang some of their show songs with enthusiasm and vigour, spreading their joy to the residents.



Before Christmas Team Endurance used their amazing art skills to produce Christmas cards which were then sold raising £130 money for two charities, The Nightingale Macmillan Unit at The Royal Derby Hospital and the Samaritans. The children selected the charities, **in an attempt to make Christmas time better for those in need.**

Kilburn Neighbourhood Watch

Happy New Year from all of the team at Kilburn & Denby neighbourhood Watch. We hope that everybody has had a safe and enjoyable Christmas and has settled into the New Year without too many problems.

Our team regularly receive lots of complaints of antisocial behaviour across the parish and for this reason, we have provided the following extract from the police.uk website;

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to an individual, to their community or to their environment. This could be an action by someone else that leaves you feeling alarmed, harassed or distressed. It also includes fear of crime or concern for public safety, public disorder or public nuisance.

Examples of anti-social behaviour include:

- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours
- Vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting
- Street drinking
- Environmental damage including littering, dumping of rubbish and abandonment of cars
- Prostitution related activity
- Begging and vagrancy
- Fireworks misuse
- Inconsiderate or inappropriate use of vehicles

The police, local authorities and other community safety partner agencies, such as Fire & Rescue and social housing landlords, all have a responsibility to deal with anti-social behaviour and to help people who are suffering from it.

If you are experiencing problems with anti-social behaviour, or have any concerns about it, or other community safety issues, you should contact your local council or call the non-emergency number, 101. In an emergency, call 999.

Climate change impacts upon us all and will certainly affect future generations. I am therefore fully supportive of Derbyshire County Council's proposal to commit £4 million to help tackle climate change, funded from business rates. This is to help pump prime innovation and drive development, providing an opportunity for both businesses and communities to reduce our carbon footprint. The Council will host a 'Tackling climate change together' event in March for businesses, housing developers and other councils to discuss what they can do to help. We will be bidding for cash to install electric vehicle points around the county and plan to introduce a new grant scheme, called Climate Action Grants, to support local communities to take-action on climate change.

Over a 10 day period, Derbyshire experienced excessive rainfall, suffering one month's amount of rain in a single day alone. This caused significant damage to our Highway infrastructure and became a major incident. There were in excess of 200 flood areas across Derbyshire, 7 landslips, 25 highway structures (bridges) and 124 miles of road affected, together with 13,481 gullies and associated drainage connections. The cost of this damage alone is estimated at over £20 million, note the Highways annual maintenance budget is less than £18m. With the rain continuing and further damage being discovered on a daily basis, the Highways Crews who normally repair potholes are working tirelessly with other staff to address this damage to minimise the weather's continued impact on our highway network. We are lobbying Government for additional funding to address this damage, so please bear with us, because potholes will take longer to repair as we are still in the recovery process.

Trading Standards recently helped two pensioners get their money back after being separately subjects of scams totalling £52,500. If you have been victim of a scam or need advice you can contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Services tel: 03454 040506, report fraud to Action Fraud tel: 0300 123 2040. Trading Standards' advice is to register your home phone to opt out of unsolicited and marketing calls via the free Telephone Preference Service. These scams are sophisticated, so please be vigilant and there is nothing wrong in being suspicious and taking advice before you do something involving giving out bank details or transferring money.

Responsibility for the National Child Measurement Programme, which involves the annual measurement of the height and weight of children in Reception Class and Year 6 has recently been passed to Derbyshire County Council as part of their responsibility for delivering public health services. Parents will receive a letter to obtain their consent and have an option to opt out. All information is confidential and will not be revealed to the child or teachers. As Chair of the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service, I am very proud that following an inspection by Her Majesty's Inspector of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services, Derbyshire was one of only 16 Fire Services nationally to be awarded a 'good' rating across all 3 categories. Being deemed 'Outstanding' for promoting the right values and culture across the service. This was a pleasing end to 2019, which also saw Derbyshire Fire Service being voted Emergency Service of the Year. This is true testament to the excellent work by all the staff and thoroughly deserved. The Fire Service has published 'Our Plan 2020-2023' which is about how we continue to prevent, protect and respond to the needs of our communities whilst continuing to make Derbyshire Safer. It is currently out for public consultation, which closes on the 7th February 2020, please have your say via www.derbyshire-fire.gov.uk. Consultation documents are also available at Ripley and other Libraries.

Notes from the parish council meeting:

On behalf of the Parish Council I would like to wish all residents a Happy New Year.

The January meeting commenced with a minute's silence in memory Gerald Hazlewood who passed away before Christmas and his funeral was held on Thursday 9th January.

Cllr Gordon Parkin has resigned from the Parish Council due to his moving to another area. Therefore a vacancy exists. Anybody interested should contact the Clerk.

A review of the Carol Service held on Friday 6th December was undertaken. Owing to the Junior School holding their shopping event on the same evening – fewer people than normal attended the Carol Service which also included the switching on of lights by the Mayor of Amber Valley Borough Council, Cllr John Walker. Consequently, fewer people took refreshments after. The Parish Council are considering holding the event on a different evening in 2020 but this would be dependant upon the availability of those involved. If residents have any comments they wish to make, please do so via the Council's website.

The Parish Council are still looking for somebody to edit the Kilburn News – please see the separate advertisement. Further, unless additional volunteers are found to deliver the Kilburn News the future of the publication will remain in doubt. Again, please see separate article.

The Parish Council have asked the County Council whether it would be possible for bollards to be erected on the pavement outside the Nursery School to prevent vehicles parking illegally. The Parish Council has received a negative response from DCC but are to pursue the matter.

Kilburn Parish Council have committed to an Armed Forces Covenant. In essence this means that the Parish Council will raise awareness of the Armed Forces. It will recognise military veterans as a valued part of the community; encourage local business to support the employment of Service spouses and partners; it will promote Armed Forces events. Further details will be advertised on the Parish Council's web site in due course.

The Council set the budget for 2020/21 with a Precept of £55024 which is approximately a 3% increase on the current year.

A community litter pick will be held on SATURDAY 4TH APRIL. Residents are urged to attend – all equipment will be supplied by the P.C. Please see noticeboards and web site for further details.

The Council has received complaints of the noise emanating from the A38 and has forwarded these complaints to the Highways Agency with little success. The Parish Council has therefore passed its concerns to Nigel Mills M.P.

Kilburn Parish Council meeting cntd....

The litter bin on Chapel St adjacent to the Fish Bar was recently removed by Amber Valley Borough Council. This bin was well used – especially by pedestrians using the Pitfield footpath. The Parish Council is pursuing the Borough Council for its replacement.

It has been agreed to support the Speedwatch Campaign currently operated by the Neighbourhood Watch Team. Again, see the separate article asking for volunteers.

The surgery continues to remain under extreme pressure during the winter months. We are continuing to do our best to keep up with demand but we appreciate that you may not be able to get an appointment as quickly as you may have done in the past.

Did you know that it isn't always necessary to have an appointment at the practice at all? As one of our patients you are able to self-refer to lots of different services that will help you to live well and stay well. These include:

Physiotherapy/ Occupational therapy

A physiotherapist or occupational therapist can see you with all kinds of joint and muscular problems including arthritis, sprains and injuries. They can be contacted on 01335 230079.

Counselling

If you are feeling down, anxious or stressed then you can self-refer for talking therapies. People are often worried that they won't know what to say, but therapists are trained to manage this and you will have an initial assessment that will ensure you get the right type of talking therapy for you. There are details of local services on-line (just search for "Trent PTS" or "Talking mental health Derbyshire").

Support at home

If you think you or your relative could benefit from some additional help at home, be that from carers, help with meals or getting dressed, or getting some additional equipment to stay mobile then ring Call Derbyshire on 01629 533190 and they can get you sorted.

Minor Injuries Unit

The team at the Minor Injuries Unit in Ripley can see you with sprains, broken bones, wound infections, minor head or eye injuries and animal bites amongst other things. They are open from 8am to 8pm every day including weekends.

And remember, if you (or someone you are with) is experiencing a medical emergency, such as chest pain, loss of consciousness, breathing difficulties or a stroke please ring 999. Every second counts with these conditions.
